Since its launch in 1998, Disney Cruise Line has established itself as a leader in the cruise industry, providing a setting where families can reconnect, adults can recharge and children can experience all Disney has to offer.

Today, Disney Cruise Line continues to expand its blueprint for family cruising with a fleet of six ships - the Disney Magic, Disney Wonder, Disney Dream, Disney Fantasy, Disney Wish and Disney Treasure - with seven more ships planned by 2031.

Guests can sail out of ports around the world on exciting itineraries to the Caribbean, Bahamas, Alaska, Europe, and Australia, among others.

Disney Cruise Line has two year-round homeports in Florida - Port Canaveral and Port Everglades.

OVERVIEW

NEW DEVELOPMENTS



Disney Cruise Line is experiencing a period of unprecedented growth, further strengthening its position as a leader in family cruising, offering even more ways for families to experience Disney magic and world-class service at sea.

In June 2024, Disney Cruise Line welcomed guests for the first time to its second island destination, Disney Lookout Cay at Lighthouse Point, located on the island of Eleuthera in The Bahamas. Disney collaborated with talented artists and cultural advisors in The Bahamas who helped shape an experience that celebrates the natural beauty, traditions, and artistry of The Bahamas.

The Disney Treasure, the second of three ships being built at the Meyer Werft shipyard in Germany through 2025, launched in December 2024 from Port Canaveral. The Disney Treasure joins the Disney Wish (2022), while the third ship in the class, the Disney Destiny, will debut in late 2025 from Fort Lauderdale, Florida and will feature a heroes and villains-inspired theme.

In March 2023, Disney Cruise Line and Singapore Tourism Board announced an agreement to collaborate to homeport a brand-new Disney cruise ship, the Disney Adventure, exclusively in Singapore for at least five years beginning in 2025. More details about the maiden voyage, itineraries and onboard experiences will be announced at a later date.

In July 2024, Disney and Oriental Land Co. (OLC), Ltd. announced a new agreement that will bring year-round Disney cruise vacations to Japan. Under a recently signed agreement, OLC will build and operate a Disney-branded cruise business in Japan, expected to commence by early 2029.

This past August 2024, Disney Cruise Line announced an additional four ships that will join the award-winning fleet by 2031, giving families more opportunities to experience the world-class dining, exceptional entertainment, and signature hospitality that Disney Cruise Line is known for.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Disney Cruise Line strives to make a positive impact in the many places we sail around the world. Recent initiatives include the delivery of mobile movie theaters to children's hospitals and donations to charitable organizations in our port communities. Cast and crew members annually donate thousands of hours of their personal time to reading education programs in schools, shore cleanups to remove trash and debris from fragile coastlines and beautification projects at hospitals and care facilities. In The Bahamas, additional outreach efforts include programs designed to inspire youth to pursue careers in the maritime industry, donating books and other school supplies to children in the community, building gardens at schools and a local foster care organization, supporting and collaborating with students on the Eleuthera Junior Junkanoo Competition and several other initiatives that support business development and Bahamian ownership in the tourism sector.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

Disney Cruise Line is committed to minimizing its impact on the environment by reducing emissions, minimizing waste, conserving water, protecting oceans and wildlife and more. Learn more dclnews.com.

Eliminating single-use plastics: Disney Cruise Line has taken great measures to eliminate single-use plastics onboard its ships and at its island destinations in The Bahamas. Among other initiatives, Disney Cruise Line eliminated the use of plastic straws; replaced plastic amenity containers with refillable bath product dispensers in all guest staterooms; stopped using plastic merchandise bags fleetwide; and removed plastic cutlery, stirrers and condiment packets. Insulated paper cups are used in place of disposable polystyrene ones, and plastic bottles were replaced with recyclable aluminum ones. Refillable water stations are installed in both guest and crew member areas.

Recycling: Disney Cruise Line is committed to diverting waste from traditional waste streams through extensive onboard recycling efforts, including trained crew members who carefully sort materials into appropriate recycling receptacles. Shipboard recycling processes have helped to eliminate on average more than 2,900 tons of metals, glass, paper, cardboard and plastic from traditional waste streams each year.

Investing in new fuels: Disney Cruise Line is investing in alternative fuels like liquefied natural gas (LNG) and hydrotreated vegetable oil (HVO). In addition, Disney Cruise Line is actively exploring bio-LNG, green methanol, and other fuel sources to encourage their development at scale within the maritime industry.

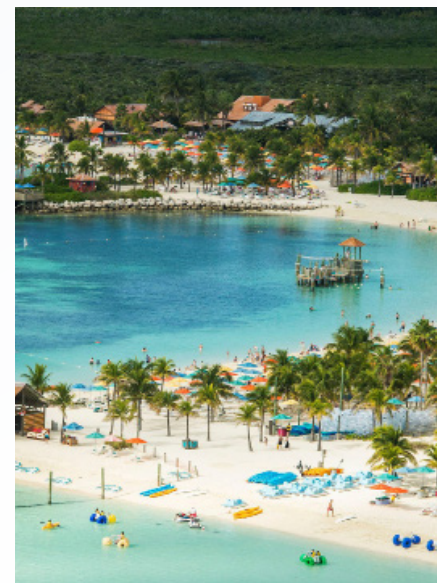

ITINERARIES

In early 2025, Disney Cruise Line will feature new and fan-favorite itineraries, bringing guests more options for fun in the sun from four home ports in the United States. From voyages that stop at one or both of Disney Cruise Line's island destinations in The Bahamas, to the Disney Treasure's inaugural season of seven-night voyages to the Eastern and Western Caribbean, to a tropical sailing to Hawaii or the South Pacific aboard the Disney Wonder, early 2025 will provide a myriad of adventures.

Disney Cruise Line will continue to sail to fan-favorite destinations in summer 2025, offering unforgettable family vacations around the world. Itinerary options include tropical getaways to The Bahamas and Caribbean from Florida, adventures of grandeur in Alaska and, for the first time ever, European sailings to the Mediterranean and Northern Europe on board the Disney Fantasy.

DISNEY CASTAWAY CAY

A favored stop on most Bahamian and Caribbean itineraries is Disney's Castaway Cay, a 1,000-acre private island with turquoise waters, powdery white sand beaches and swaying palm trees that is exclusive to Disney Cruise Line guests. With an authentic island barbecue and plenty of snorkeling and water sports, Castaway Cay provides Disney Cruise Line guests with a day of adventure, relaxation and quality time with the family.

DISNEY LOOKOUT CAY AT LIGHTHOUSE POINT

Disney Lookout Cay at Lighthouse Point, Disney Cruise Line's newest destination on the island of Eleuthera, The Bahamas, is a one-of-a-kind retreat that immerses guests in the spirit and culture of The Bahamas, along with signature Disney entertainment, port adventures and nature trails, a water play area, and beautiful beaches for families and adults. A day at Disney Lookout Cay at Lighthouse Point offers something for everyone.

- It’s A Small World Nursery is a full-service nursery for children ages 6 months to 3 years, while Disney’s Oceaneer Club welcomes kids ages 3-10 and Edge and Vibe accommodate teens and tweens ages 11-17.
- Adults can relax at the Senses Spa & Salon and the adult-only pool area, enjoy fine Italian and French dining and relax or dance the night away in a variety of adult-exclusive bars and lounges.
- Adults on the Disney Wish and Disney Treasure can dine at Enchanté, featuring a gourmet menu crafted by three Michelin-starred Chef Arnaud Lallement of L’Assiette Champenoise, near Reims, France — one of the culinary masterminds behind the French-inspired fine-dining experience at Remy aboard the Disney Dream and Disney Fantasy.

FACTS & FIRSTS

- In 2019, Disney Cruise Line announced it’s the first major cruise line to provide complimentary texting to crew members onboard its ships, making it easier for shipboard teams to stay connected to their loved ones while working away from home.
- Disney was granted special permission by the U.S. Coast Guard to paint its lifeboats yellow – rather than the traditional regulation color of orange – to preserve the Mickey Mouse color palette of red, yellow and black.
- Disney Cruise Line was the first cruise line to present a fireworks display at sea.
- Families on the Disney Wish and Disney Treasure are immersed in the world of Mickey Mouse animated shorts on the first Disney attraction at sea, AquaMouse. Complete with show scenes, lighting and special effects, and splashtacular surprises, this first-of-its-kind water ride sends guests on a fun family adventure through 760 feet of winding tubes suspended high above the upper decks.
- On the Disney Treasure, guests can experience the first stage adaptation of Moana and dine in the first “Coco”-themed theatrical dining experience at Plaza de Coco.
